Before becoming a trustee in 2010 Peter chaired the *Catholic Parent Involvement Committee* and currently chairs the board's *Linkages Committee* responsible for reaching out to ratepayers, stakeholders, local politicians and Catholic groups to preserve and promote Catholic education.

Peter says: "The last 2 1/2 years have definitely been a joy and a challenge. Our board has faced many changes, enrollment challenges, boundary reviews, accommodation and school closure reviews. When given the opportunity, I seek knowledge, information and facts prior to making a decision or searching for compromise. Challenges to catholic education and funding in Ontario will continue to be among the most pressing of the issues, as well as continued declining enrollment, forcing more accommodation reviews and boundary changes to satisfy government regulations. When necessary, your feedback and input on these issues as they arise are very important, and I will take all of your comments and suggestions into account before making any decisions on your behalf".

Welcome Bishop Daniel Miehm!!

On February 20, 2013, the *Vatican* announced the appointment of *Reverend Fr. Daniel J. Miehm*, as *Auxiliary Bishop of the Diocese of Hamilton* by His Holiness, *Pope Benedict XVI*.



Bishop Miehm was born on August 27, 1960 in Kitchener, Ontario. He is a graduate of the former *St. Jerome's High School* in Kitchener and *St. Jerome's University* in Waterloo. After studies at *St. Augustine's Seminary* in Toronto he was ordained to the Priesthood on May 6, 1989 at the Cathedral of Christ the King in Hamilton.

He was ordained Auxiliary Bishop of Hamilton at the Cathedral on May 7, 2013.



Bishop Miehm holds a Master's degree in Divinity from St. Augustine's Seminary and a Licentiate in Canon Law from the *University of St. Tomasso (Angelicum)* in Rome.

Bishop Miehm has served as a Priest in the Diocese of Hamilton since his ordination. During his ministry, he served as Associate Pastor at St. Francis Xavier Parish in Stoney Creek and the Cathedral of Christ the King in Hamilton and as Pastor at Our Lady of Lourdes Parish in Hamilton and St. Ann Parish in Ancaster. During this time, Bishop Miehm has also served as a member and representative on various Councils in the Diocese. From 1996 to 2012, he served as Judge and Defender of the Bond on the *Toronto Regional Marriage Tribunal*.

In June 2012, he was appointed Founding Pastor of St. Benedict Parish in Milton where he was serving at the time of his appointment as Auxiliary Bishop of Hamilton. Bishop Miehm is also Chaplain for the **St. Thomas More Lawyers' Guild**.





We begin with the common sense observation that in today's culture in the Western World, the speed of our culture in terms of how fast it moves is very high. Many cultural critics and professional care-givers and other thinkers are beginning to think that the speed is too high for human wellbeing. The medical profession is also beginning to speak of a new disorder many of us are beginning to develop – nature deficit disorder: in simple terms, this means we are not interacting <u>enough</u> with Nature and its restorative elements and this is literally starting to make us sick.

So, all of us need to invest in our wellbeing and in our future lives. Summer is a God-given time for most of us to do some of this. We need to rouse ourselves a bit to do this because when our health is not too bad (as is the case for most of us); we easily get lulled into complacency.

So, this summer play and recreate and rest. Recently my attention has been caught by *Participaction Canada's* television advertisement that we need to get our <u>children</u> to play again because it is good for them health-wise; this applies to us as adults too!
