


2017 Distinguished Graduate Award

In May, 2017 four *WCDSB* schools were awarded "Healthy Schools" certifications by the *Ontario Physical and Health Education Association (OPHEA)*. Healthy Schools certifications were awarded to 174 schools across Ontario, representing 41 of 72 school boards -- Gold (86), Silver (68) and Bronze (20). The four schools are: *St. Benedict CSS* (Gold), *Resurrection CSS* (Silver), *St. Joseph CES* (Silver) and *St. Michael CES* (Silver).

In May, the Board was honoured by the *Mood Disorders Society of Canada* with the national *J.J. Pickell Mental Health Award*, in recognition of our work in implementing the successful *Elephant in the Room Program*. Director of Education *Loretta Notten*, Superintendent *Laura Shoemaker* and Mental Health Lead *Amanda Warne* accepted the award on behalf of Board staff.

Board Administration Presents Catholic Trustees with \$271.8 Million Balanced Budget

Student achievement, labour investments and capital improvements are focus of budget plan



The 2017-18 budget anticipates enrolment will continue to increase in both elementary and secondary schools in the upcoming year. This increased enrolment, along with provincially-negotiated labour agreements, accounts for the large year over year funding change for the Board. The budget aligns closely with the Board's *MYSP*.



Strategic Plan "Report Card"

The WCDSB Multi-Year Strategic Plan (MYSP) 2015-18 sets out to prioritize our work in the areas of:


- ✓ Nurturing Our Catholic Community
- ✓ Student Engagement, Innovation and Achievement
- ✓ Building Capacity to Lead, Learn and Live Authentically

Embedded in these priority areas are 32 specific MYSP goals. Earlier this year, Board staff undertook a comprehensive survey of students, staff, clergy, Trustees and other community members to assess the progress being made toward each goal and identify any areas for improvement. Respondents were asked to rate on a scale of 1 to 5 the extent to which they agree that the Board is delivering as promised in each of the 32 goal statements. The survey garnered 1525 respondents. Here is a snapshot of the overall results:



At the mid-point of our 2015-2018 Strategic Plan, we find that 5 of 9 strategic directions and 23 of 32 goals are progressing at an optimal level, having been rated at "Green" - "Effectively Meeting Standard". Four of the 9 Strategic Directions have some combination of "Green" -- "Effectively Meeting Standard" and "Orange" -- "Approaching Criteria", with the majority still being "Green", as only 9 of 32 goals have been deemed to be "Orange". There are no goals that have been assessed at "Red" - "Not Meeting Criteria". There are many points of celebration and there is clear direction in terms of the work for the year ahead. 
